BEYOND DISNEY AND PIXAR

We love Disney and Pixar films as much as anyone, but they corner the market for what animated films are shown in theaters. There is a wealth of wonderful kids' movies (particularly animated) being made worldwide that just don't get the marketing and distribution Disney/Pixar does. Disney must be aware because they acquired the US distribution rights to Studio Ghibli films in the early 2000s.

Here are a few animated films we recommend that stir children's imaginations beyond the scope of Disney and Marvel:

Ernest & Celestine (2012)

The story of an unlikely friendship between Ernest the bear and a young mouse named Celestine. Beautifully animated in a watercolor style, it features the voice talents of Forest Whitaker, Lauren Bacall, and Paul Giamatti. Nominated for an Oscar in 2013.

Song of the Sea (2014)

Irish director Tomm Moore brings Celtic folktales to life with this story of Ben, a young Irish boy, and his little sister, Saoirse, a girl who can turn into a seal, who go on an adventure to free the fairies and save the

spirit world. Jaw-droppingly beautiful in every sense of the word, this film was nominated for an Oscar in 2015.

Shaun The Sheep Movie (2015)

Tired of working on the farm, Shaun takes his flock and the farmer's dog, Bitzer, into his own "temporary escape plan" after an unexpected accident. Unfortunately, in the big city, the farmer is diagnosed with amnesia that could possibly change their normal farm life forever, and the squad sets a plan to regain the farmer's memory. Told with almost no dialogue, this is ingenious filmmaking parents will love as much as kids. Beware – it tugs the heartstrings! Created by Aardman Animations, the team behind Wallace and Gromit.
